- The **School Readiness** program can help low income families pay for the high cost of quality early care and education.
- Free **Voluntary Prekindergarten** provides high quality early education for all four or five year old children that live in Florida.
- **Early Head Start** provides quality early care education and family support services to children ages 0 to 3 and families residing in high-need neighborhoods.
- The **Warm-Line** provides free consultation, referrals, curriculum and classroom adaptations for children with special needs and/or developmental delays.

- **Child Care Resource & Referral** provides free customized referrals and financial assistance information about child care programs. Information on starting new child care businesses and program supports for providers also available.

School Readiness program helps low income families pay for the cost of high quality early care and education.

How to Qualify

- Parent must work or attend an educational program a minimum 20 hours a week
- Parents must apply for school readiness in the county of residence
- Family income must be at or below 150% of Federal Poverty Level (FPL) for eligibility
